## **Theresa Glomb - Keynote**

Theresa Glomb is a professor at the University of Minnesota's Carlson School of Management and holds the Toro Company–David M. Lilly Chair. For more than 25 years, her research has focused on how small, intentional changes at work can meaningfully improve performance, well-being, and satisfaction. Her work helps individuals and organizations foster growth, happiness, and more positive experiences at work.

Dr. Glomb earned her PhD in social, organizational, and individual differences psychology from the University of Illinois and her BA in psychology from DePaul University. She has published extensively in leading academic journals, including the Academy of Management Journal and the Journal of Applied Psychology, and her research has been featured in outlets such as The Wall Street Journal, The Economist, and Huffington Post. She is also the speaker behind the TEDx talk "Let's Make Work Better."

When she's not reshaping how we think about the workplace, Theresa is navigating the art of sending her kids off to college, all while upholding their family motto: "Work Hard. Have Fun. Choose Kind. Be Present."

## **Bradley (Brad) Bluml – Chief of Police, City of Ramsey**

Brad Bluml serves as the Chief of Police for the City of Ramsey, bringing more than 20 years of dedicated service and leadership to the community. 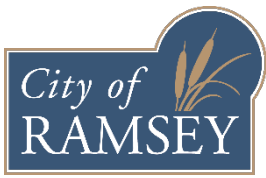

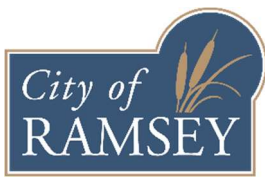
## **Business Expo** (Spring)

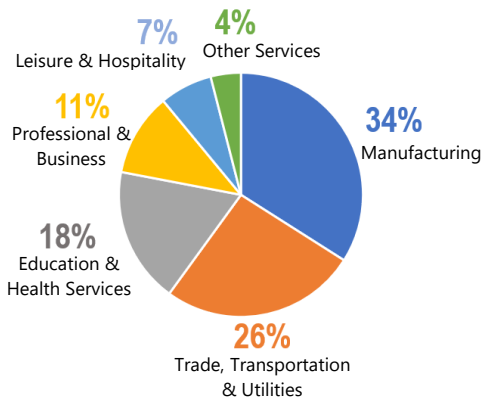

# Business Succession Planning

## **Communities, get ready for a wave of retirements**

What happens to your favorite local businesses and shops when the owner(s) retires? Small business owners in Minnesota are aging. The most recent U.S. Census data from 2021 shows that about 53% of owners are 55+ years old — this number has been increasing. By 2030, all owners who are baby boomers (born between 1946 and 1964) will be at least 65 and retired or considering when to take that step.

## **How can communities and business owners prepare?**

Having a business succession and transition plan is important. To help with creating a plan and moving through the process, University of MN Extension Community Development has tools and resources you may use. 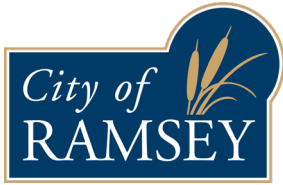

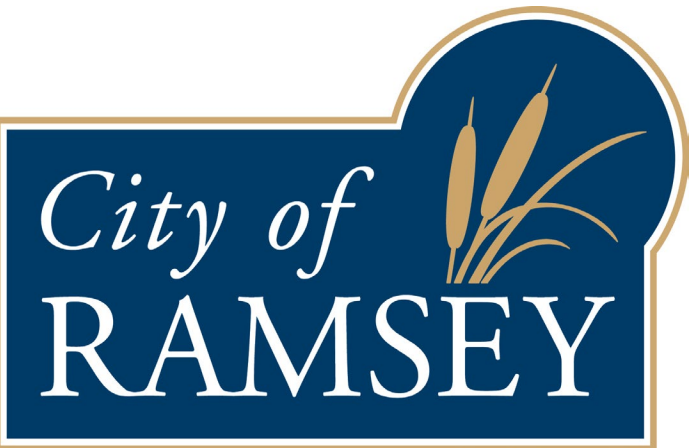

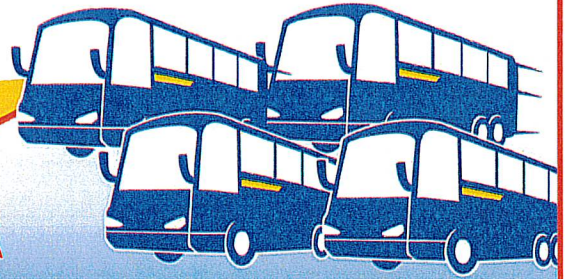

## Metro Transit will transition from commuter rail to expanded bus service.

The last day of Northstar Commuter Rail service will be Jan. 4, 2026, with special event service provided for the final Minnesota Vikings' regular season home game. Until that time, Northstar service will continue to operate as scheduled.

Beginning Monday, Jan. 5, more frequent and flexible bus service will begin along the corridor between downtown Minneapolis and Big Lake Station area.

## More trips, more flexibility

With this transition, the Northstar corridor will see a tenfold increase in trips – from about 40 train trips per week today to nearly 400 weekly bus trips. This expanded service will better match current travel patterns, offering more flexibility at a lower cost to operate.

## New Routes

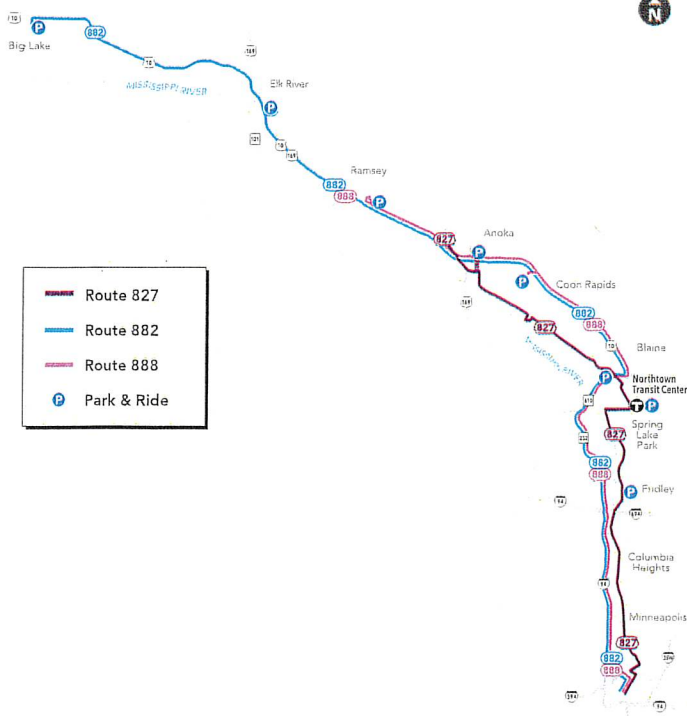


### Beginning Dec. 6, 2025

- Route 827 (replacing Route 852), will travel between **Fridley** and **downtown Minneapolis**.

### Beginning Jan. 5, 2026

- Route 888 will serve existing Northstar stops in **Ramsey, Anoka, Coon Rapids, and downtown Minneapolis**.
- Route 882, as part of a two-year pilot, service will be provided between **Big Lake, Elk River, and downtown Minneapolis** on weekdays. Metro Transit will operate this service under an agreement with MnDOT.

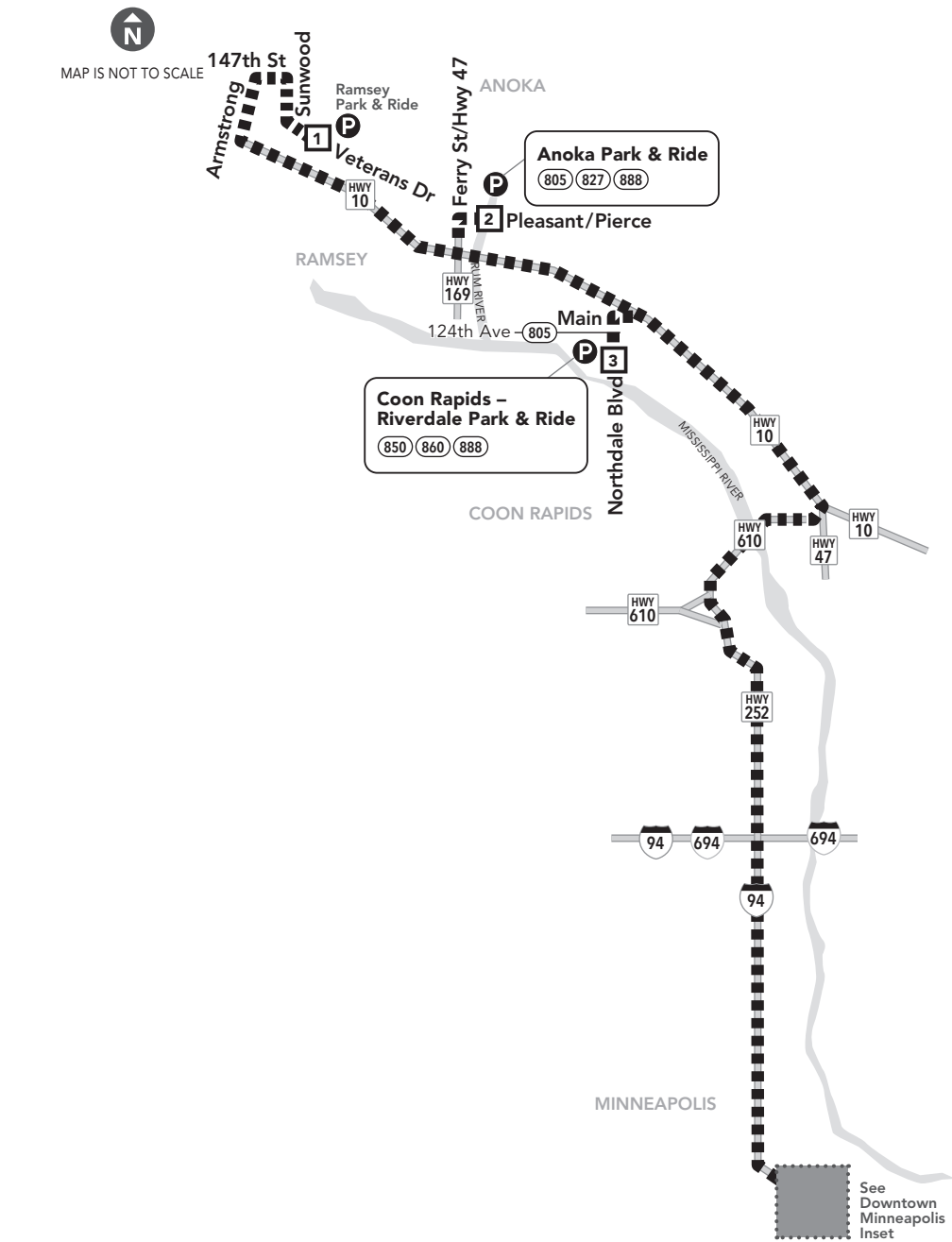

Reading a schedule:  
a step-by-step guide

1. Find the schedule for the **day** of the week and the **direction** you plan to travel.
2. Look at the map and find the **timepoints** nearest your trip start and end points. Your stop may be between timepoints.
3. Read down the column to see what **time** a bus will depart from a given timepoint. Read across a row to see when the bus will reach another timepoint. If the time is blank, that trip does not serve that timepoint.

Not all stops are shown on this timetable.

Use the timepoints on the map and the schedule to estimate the arrival of your bus. For details, call Transit Information or explore our interactive map and trip planning tools at metrotransit.org.

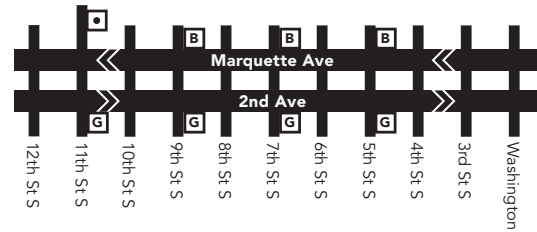

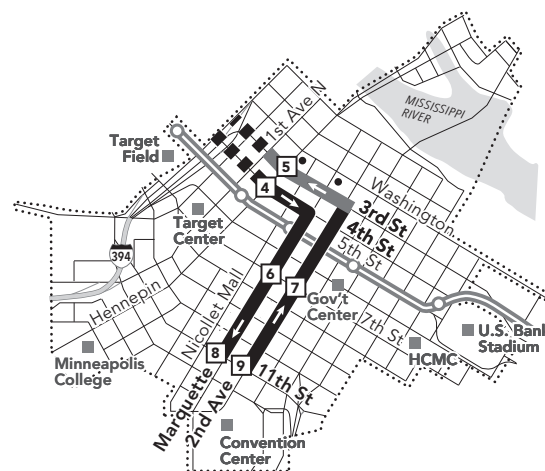

How to Ride

BUSES

1. Arrive 5 minutes before the schedule or NexTrip says your trip will depart.
2. Watch for your bus number.
3. Pay your fare as you board, except for Pay Exit routes.
4. Pull the cord above the window about 1 block before your stop to signal the driver.

METRO LINES

1. Arrive 5 minutes before the schedule or NexTrip says your trip will depart.
2. Pay BEFORE you board—touch your card to a reader on the platform or buy a ticket from the machine.
3. Push the blue button to open doors (trains only).
4. METRO LRT lines stop at every station. METRO BRT lines stop at stations on demand and when customers are present.

MAKING CONNECTIONS

Transfer between buses and METRO lines for up to 2½ hours with your fare.

Those who try to ride without paying may be subject to a fine.
